



## Tints of Nature Permanent Hair Colours

### Colour Selection and Grey Coverage:

The colour number signifies the depth of colour; 1 is the darkest and 10 the lightest. To select a colour, first work out what your natural base colour is. You can do this by comparing your hair with the swatch ring or colour selector guide on the leaflet.

Tints of Nature is ideal for staying on the same depth of colour as your natural base or for going darker. However, it will only lighten hair by about one level. For example, if you are a natural base 3, you can use Tints of Nature to lift your hair to a base 4, but will not be able to achieve a shade lighter than base 4. So if you are a natural base 3, you can use shades which are on bases 1 - 4 from the Tints of Nature range.

To cover grey, you need to use one of the natural colours – either by itself or mixed in equal quantities with one of the fashion shades, for example: 25ml of 7N plus 25ml of 7D plus 50ml of Colourfix (activator)

### Colour Mixing:

The Tints of Nature colours can be mixed together to create your own shades. Always consider your skin tone, the colour of your eyes, as well as the predominant colours in your wardrobe before choosing your new hair colour. Our experts are on hand to give you advice. Here are a few handy hints to get you started:

1. If you are mixing two colours with different base numbers together, you will usually end up with a base shade somewhere in the middle, for example, if you mix together 3N and 5N, you will achieve a 4N.
2. The ash shades (4C, 6C and 8C) are ideal for counteracting red tones in red.
3. Remember to measure colours accurately for the best result.

### Directions for Use:

An instruction leaflet is included in each colour box.

Always carry out a sensitivity test before you use Tints of Nature Permanent Hair Colours. We also strongly recommend that you do a strand test before use, particularly if you are using a shade for the first time or over other hair colours.

### Ingredients:

Tints of Nature permanent hair colours use the most natural ingredients possible to create a highly effective product. Any synthetic raw materials are used only where there is no natural alternative. While the colours do contain PPDs (paraphenylenediamines), we use the lowest amounts possible to be able to cover grey hair; on average PPDs comprise 0.36% of the product, including a true Black.
